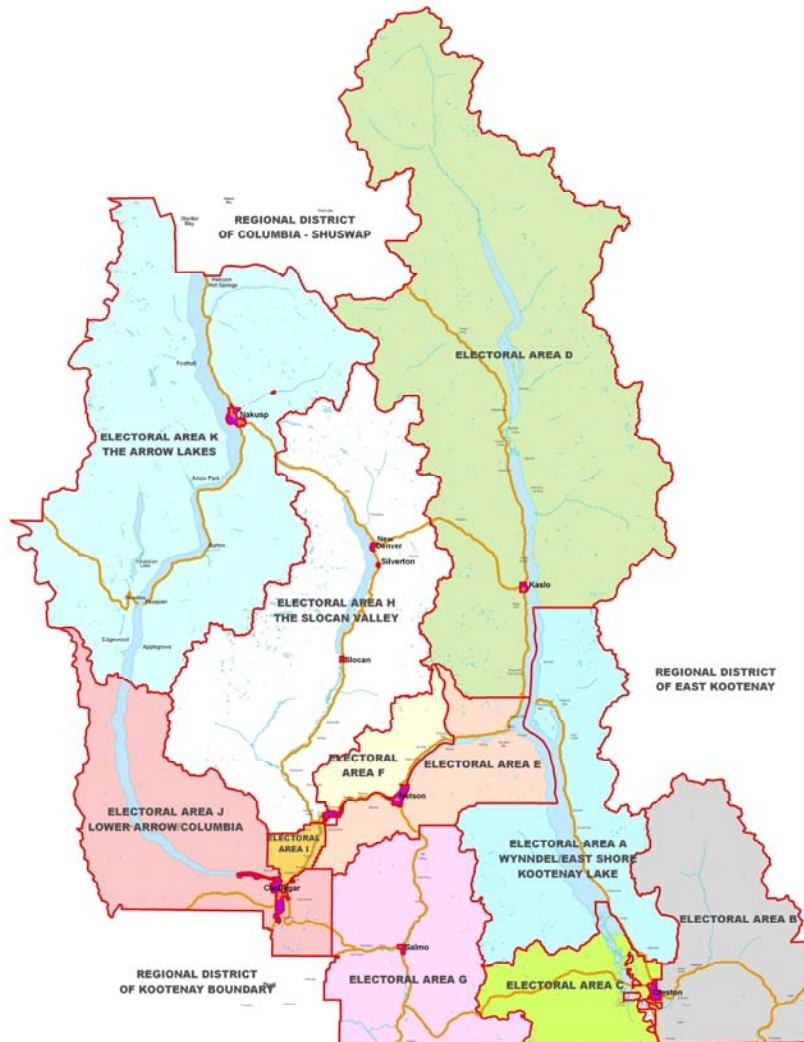




# KNOW YOUR REGIONAL DISTRICT



## MISSION STATEMENT

To facilitate the provision of services and to represent the residents of the Regional District of Central Kootenay in the most efficient and financially and administratively effective means possible in a fashion that meets the needs of the residents.

## OVERVIEW

The Regional District of Central Kootenay (RDCK) is one of 27 regional districts in the Province of British Columbia created to provide local government services and political accountability to residents of the unincorporated electoral (rural) areas.

Regional Districts also provide a federated approach to facilitating issues and services that transcend municipal boundaries and functions as a working partnership between the municipalities and rural areas. Any combination of municipalities and electoral areas can jointly provide a service -- with the costs recovered from the residents that benefit from that service -- thus providing efficient service delivery in a cost-effective manner.

The Regional District system of local government provides a political forum for direct representation of regional residents, local control over issues and services of local interest and a mechanism for advancing the interests of the region as a whole.

Regional Districts are governed by the Local Government Act which establishes a legal framework and assigns roles and responsibilities to local government.

## REGIONAL DISTRICT OF CENTRAL KOOTENAY

The RDCK was incorporated in November 1965; one of the first of 12 Districts created at the time.

The Regional District of Central Kootenay (RDCK) covers an area of some 23,000 sq. km. and has a population of approximately 58,000 people. The RDCK extends from the headwaters of the Duncan River at the north to the International Border at a point just south of Fruitvale and extends from the area east of Creston to the mountaintops west of the Arrow Lakes above Needles.

A Board comprised of eleven (11) Electoral Area Directors representing rural residents and nine (9) Municipal Directors representing residents of the member municipalities governs the RDCK. The Board responds to locally expressed needs for services and consults with residents about which services it can provide, where they are to be provided and how the services are to be financed.

Of the 11 electoral areas, Area A is located on the east side of Kootenay Lake; Areas B and C surround the Town of Creston; Area D reaches from the headwaters of the Duncan River to Coffee Creek south of Kaslo; Areas E and F cover all of the area around Nelson and the West Arm of Kootenay Lake; Area G includes Ymir and surrounds the Village of Salmo, Area H extends from west of Nakusp and south to the Playmor Junction; Areas I and J surround the City of Castlegar; and Area K covers the north and south areas west of Nakusp. Member municipalities are the cities of Castlegar and Nelson, the town of Creston and the villages of Kaslo, Nakusp, New Denver, Salmo, Silvertown and Slocan.

Electoral Area Directors are elected by the voters in their respective electoral area and serve three-year terms. Municipal Directors are first elected to a municipal council and are then appointed by the council to the RDCK Board for a one-year term.

Each RDCK Director has one or more votes on most matters coming before the Board, depending upon the population represented. The most recent Canada Census statistics are used to determine population figures. For each unit of 2,500 people, a Director has one vote.

The Regional Board selects its own Chair who appoints members to various committees. The committees are assigned areas of responsibility, or, in some cases, are structured sub-regionally to address issues of specific local interest. Although some decisions can be made at the committee level, generally, committees act in an advisory capacity to the Board. In addition, Directors are appointed to committees/boards of affiliated agencies, such as the Sterile Insect Release Board and Ktunaxa-Kinbasket Treaty Advisory Committee, to represent the interests of the Regional District of Central Kootenay.

To perform its administrative and operational functions, and carry out the instructions of the Board, the RDCK is organized by departments, namely, Accounting, Administration, Development Services (Building/Planning), Community Services and Engineering and Environmental Services. In addition to its involvement in general services such as administration, building inspection, waste management and regional development services, most other services are optional, depending on requests from residents.

## DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

### BUILDING SERVICES

Building Services is responsible for administering the Regional District's Building Bylaw in the electoral areas and for delivery of inspection services to several municipalities by contract. Building Officials based in Nelson cover Electoral Areas 'D', 'E', 'F', 'G', 'I', 'J' and Salmo. The Nakusp-based Official provides inspection services to Electoral Areas 'D', 'H North' and 'K', and the Villages of Kaslo, Nakusp, New Denver and Silverton. The Creston-based Official serves Electoral Areas 'A', 'B' and 'C'.

Permits for building or altering a structure in a rural area or unincorporated community can be obtained from Building Services at the Regional District Office in Nelson, or the Regional District Building Officials in Creston or Nakusp.

### PLANNING SERVICES

Land use planning's main focus is the development of visions for communities identifying how they could be developed by taking into consideration their social, economic and environmental characteristics. The RDCK Planning Department works with the people to manage growth thereby building communities that know where they are going and how they intend to get there. The overall intent is to protect the appealing way of life experienced in Central Kootenay.

To help provide a sense of direction, several tools are used in planning including regulatory bylaws and permits. Department responsibilities include preparing and amending planning bylaws, checking building permits, evaluating Crown Land and subdivision referrals, processing ALR applications, preparing park plans, emergency response plans and a wide range of feasibility studies and creating and maintaining a mapping/G.I.S. service.

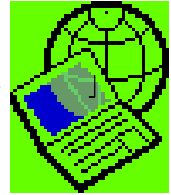
### MAPPING

Planning Services maintains and updates approximately 50,000 cadastral parcels covering the whole of the Regional District including Municipalities. Cadastral maps of all areas are available for sale. A copy of your Land Registry Survey Plan with dimensions can be obtained from the Land Title Office or the Planning Department. Electronic mapping is now available for the whole of the RDCK including municipalities and rural areas.



## GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEM


The Geographic Information System (GIS) for the Regional District forms the electronic foundation for the provision of land parcel based information and services. The data model in place allows staff at the Regional District to provide mapping and analysis functions which are specific to many Regional District services such as Land Use Planning, Building Inspection Services, Utility Services, Bylaw Enforcement, Administration, Engineering & Environmental Services, Property Information, Emergency Planning and Emergency Services (9-1-1).

## REGIONAL PARKS

All electoral areas and municipalities of the Regional District are participants in the regional parks function. As permitted by the Park (Regional) Act, the Regional District has the authority to acquire land for regional parks and trails, make rules and regulations governing the management, maintenance, improvement, operation, control and use of these lands, fix and charge fees, lease or rent regional park property for concessions, construct, maintain, operate, improve, and use buildings for the proper use and enjoyment of the regional park, and acquire land for a regional park or trail by lease agreement. Pursuant to the Park (Regional) Act, the Regional District has prepared a regional park plan.

## REGIONAL PARKS STRATEGY



The role of regional parks is, generally, to provide day-use outdoor recreation opportunities at sites that receive use from residents of two or more municipalities or electoral areas. The purpose of the regional parks plan is to establish policies for the regional parks function by developing a regional parks system that complements the plans of other recreation agencies and groups. The plan aims to provide for a diversity of local/regional recreation opportunities in the Regional District by planning and developing one or more regional parks or trails in each of the sub-regions of the Regional District.

- ☞ **MULTIPLE PURPOSE PARKS** are intended to provide for a wide range of indoor and outdoor recreation opportunities and should be capable of sustaining a high level and variety of recreational and other public use activities. These parks may be associated with waterfront access.
- ☞ **WATERFRONT ACCESS PARKS** are intended primarily to provide high quality waterfront areas and associated facilities, with the intensity of development dependent on the characteristics of each site.
- ☞ **REGIONAL TRAILS** are intended to provide for trail oriented recreation that could link communities, provide access to areas possessing scenic and special interest qualities, and provide access to Provincial recreation opportunities, Regional District Parks and other recreation sites.

## ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES



The Regional District provides a valuable service to residents of rural areas and municipalities through its Environmental Services. Concerned primarily with the removal and treatment of solid waste, the Service uses landfills, transfer stations, and recycling depots to safely dispose of and recycle about 20,000 metric tonnes of solid waste produced in the regional district each year.

To efficiently manage waste disposal throughout the large region encompassed by the RDCK, three sub-regions were established some time ago: The East Sub-region comprises Areas A, B & C and the Town of Creston. The Central Sub-region includes Areas D, E, F & G, the City of Nelson and Villages of Salmo and Kaslo. The West Sub-region encompasses Areas H, I, J, K, City of Castlegar, and Villages of Slocan, New Denver, Silverton and Nakusp.

Following the closure of two small landfills that have reached their maximum capacity—at Rosebery in the Slocan Valley and at Destiny Bay on the East Shore—the Regional District will have reduced the number of landfills from nine in 1995 to four large sites in 2006; the East Sub-region's Creston facility, the Central Sub-region's Canex (Salmo) landfill, and the West Sub-region's Ootischenia and Nakusp facilities.

Ten transfer stations are employed to move refuse from collection points to those landfills, and 30 recycling drop-off points, located throughout the Regional District, provide environmentally-sound alternatives to landfill use.

Guided by principles set out in the 1996 Regional Solid Waste Management Plan, and presently under review the RDCK's Environmental Services employs about 25 personnel in a variety of functions, from administrative to truck driving. Two recycling contractors and three landfill contractors are also employed in this function.

With so much waste generated throughout the Regional District each year, concerns naturally arise regarding the environmental safety of landfill

sites. To ensure that ground water is not adversely affected by the leaching of contaminated waste, the Regional District of Central Kootenay conducts ongoing tests at all landfill sites, sending water samples to a laboratory in Vancouver for analysis. Provincial regulations governing the disposal of solid waste provide a framework for safety in this regard. For instance, the dumping of liquids such as paint thinner and oil in landfill sites is prohibited. The RDCK also provides information to the public to assist in the safe disposal of items such as lead-acid auto batteries and containers with residual amounts of contaminated waste. There are, for instance, depots in Nelson, Creston, Rosebery, Ootischenia and Nakusp that accept paint and thinners.



Together We Can!

Work is on-going to maintain environmentally and economically-sound operations. On-going waste management planning maintains a view toward the future, and day-to-day operations, conducted in accordance with the Ministry of Environment's Waste Management Act, serve the whole of the Regional District.

Solid waste management is just one of many functions provided to residents by the Regional District, but it is an important one. The next time you wrap a twist-tie around a green garbage bag, you might pause for a moment to consider that while you'll say goodbye to trash at the curb, other people will be busy ensuring that it goes where it belongs, and that its impact on the environment is minimized.

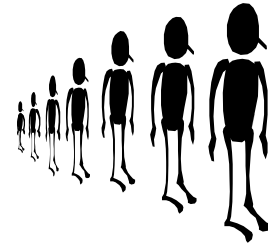
The Regional District is in the process of updating the Waste Management Plan with the future in mind. We will be in communities throughout the region seeking your input and support towards our Plan amendment.
